#### **School Donation**

Our school donation is \$200 per child. This money is used to pay for a large number of additional curriculum resources, subsidise a number of school wide activities such as swimming, production, art, dance and drama resources, sporting functions, developmental material and related photocopying and other essential resources. No child is excluded from using these resources but it does seem that quite a number of families relied on the goodwill of others to support their child.

Each term the BOT puts all the names of those donations that have been made into a draw to give one child the chance to have their fees paid for the following term. The families that have received these in the past have been very grateful. We understand that a donation is voluntary and that it can be at times very difficult to manage. Mrs Reid in the office, is very happy to discuss possible arrangements for meeting this cost for your child. Each small contribution adds up across the course of time and helps to enhance the substance of this school.

#### How To Help Your Child at School

As a parent, there are many things you can do at home to help your child have a good school year. These include making sure your child gets enough sleep, getting them to school on time, and reading at home every day. Below are some other tips.

#### A healthy diet and exercise

Children who eat a healthy diet and get regular exercise can concentrate better during the school day. It is important that your child eats a balanced diet with plenty of fruits and vegetables, and has opportunities to exercise every day through a sports team, fun activity, or playtime outside.

#### Sleep

Getting enough sleep will help your child get up on time, feel good, and be ready for a full day of learning. Children need different amounts of sleep at different ages.

5-6 Years Old: 10 - 12 hours per day 7-12 Years Old: 10 - 11 hours per day 12-13 Years Old: 9 - 10 hours per day

#### Getting to school, every day and on time

It will be easier for your child to complete daily learning, home learning, and assessments if they get to school on time every day. Limit the time your child misses for family trips and activities. Contact the school immediately if your child is absent.

#### **Home learning**

Help your child set a regular time and place for home learning. Choose a time that works well for your family's schedule. Find a place that is quiet and has good lighting. Make sure your child has supplies such as pens, pencils, paper etc. Ask your child to show you their finished home learning each night so that you can see what they are learning and confirm that they are completing all their home learning.

#### Limit television, videogame, and computer time

Limit the time your child spends watching TV, playing video games, and using the computer. When possible, do these activities together, and look for educational programs and games. Help your child understand that they should never give out personal information on the computer or talk to strangers online.

Ask your child to tell you about the school day. Ask them what they have learnt, and how they felt during the day. Listen carefully to their answers, and help them think of ways to solve any problems that they might be having in their schoolwork or in the classroom.

#### Reading

Set aside time to read with your child each day. You can make reading a part of daily routines by reading stories at bedtime and keeping lots of books and magazines in the house.

#### Learning at home

Help your child learn at home by sharing activities together, singing, talking, and telling stories. Visit educational places such as museums, the zoo, the park, or a historical monument. Find out what your child's interests are, and look for activities and books that are connected to that interest.

Photolife will coming to school on Wednesday 4 September (Team Te Ohanga & Team Kiwi) and Thursday 5 September (Team Pukeko & Team Tui) to take class, individual photographs for children who are enrolled at Silverdale School.

The school has an Online Ordering System which means that the collection of money and co-ordination of orders for photos is all done by Photolife via the internet with parents accessing, viewing, ordering and paying for their child's photos online. (Every child will have a class and individual photo taken)

Please ensure your child is wearing the correct school uniform.

<u>Sibling Photographs</u> – only siblings attending Silverdale School can have their photo taken. No preschoolers or older children are permitted.

Sibling photographs will require a sibling request photo form which is now available on the school website (Noticeboard – Information & Downloads) or from the office. Photolife are not authorised to take siblings photographs without this signed consent form. Email permission will not be accepted.

The sibling request form must be received by 3.00pm Friday 30 August. Please do not contact Photolife asking for an extension on this time. The date has been set by the school.

After photo day, Photolife checks that the photographs are up to standard and then a Shoot Key slip will be issued and given to each individual student to bring home. (Approx 2-3 weeks after photo day).

As soon as you receive this you can go online, view and order your child's photograph. (A shoot key is a private 8-digit code, when entered into the online website will bring up the students images).

All orders will be sent directly to your specified home delivery address and will incur a \$6.00 postage and packing charge.

Please note: There will be no additional days scheduled for students who are away or unable to have their photo taken on the above days.

Please send your sibling request form to the office by the cut time at 3.00pm this Friday, 30 August. Consent forms will not be accepted after this time.

Photolife are not authorised to take sibling photographs without a signed consent form. This can be found on the school website (Noticeboard-Information & downlands) or from the school office.




