Celebrated each year since 1975, Te Wiki o te Reo Māori is becoming a major fixture on the national calendar, providing an opportunity for concentrated promotion, raising awareness and generating lots of interest and positive change for te reo Māori across Aotearoa.

The theme for 2019 is 'Kia kaha te reo Māori'. 'Kia kaha' is well understood in New Zealand, meaning 'be strong'. We often talk about languages as if they are people using words like wellbeing, language health, strength and revitalisation. When we say 'Kia kaha te reo Māori' we're saying 'Let's make the Māori language strong'.

Developing a sense of nationhood and unique identity.

Te Reo Māori is a taonga of Māori, guaranteed under the Treaty of Waitangi. The Māori Language Act 2016 also makes clear it is for every New Zealander and a valued part of our national identity. All who learn te reo Māori help to secure its future as a living, dynamic and rich language. As we learn, we come to appreciate that diversity is key to unity. Kia kaha!


