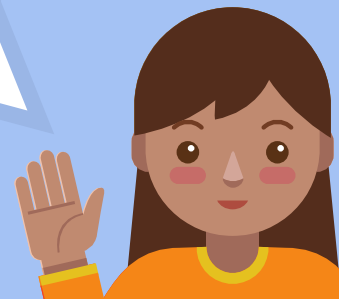

Hui ē! Tāiki ē!

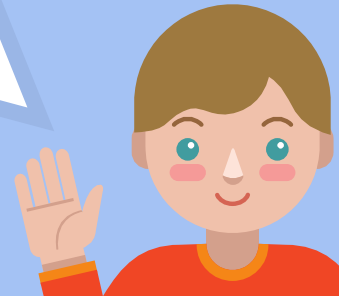
May peace be widespread

Asking how someone else is using 'ia'.

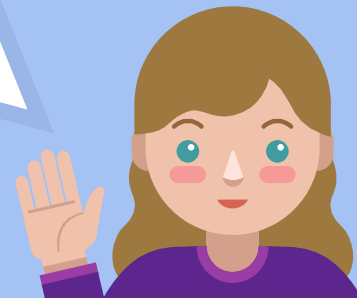
We can ask a friend how someone else is doing by using the kupu 'ia' (him/her) instead of koe (you) e.g.

Kei te pēhea ia? *How is he/she/that person?*

(Kay teh _____ e-ah?)
